



The History of Crooms Academy





As Crooms Academy confronts the role of preparing students for a high tech world, it emerges on the grounds of one of the oldest high schools in Seminole County. Founded in 1926 by Professor Crooms as Seminole County's first high school for black students, Crooms has a rich and varied past. Professor Crooms and his wife, Wealthy, donated the land on which the school was constructed. Under their guidance and

teaching, many doctors, lawyers, teachers, and business people graduated from Crooms.

Notable graduates include U.S. Representative Alcee Hastings; George Allen, the first black graduate of the University of Florida Law School; Oswald Bronson Sr., president of Bethune-Cookman College; and Bob Thomas, Sanford's first black city commissioner. Professor Crooms led Crooms Academy until his retirement in 1953.

In 1970 Seminole County was desegregated and Crooms lost its identity as a community high school. Its role changed several times and has included an administrative

center, a school for students with behavior problems, and a place for pregnant teenagers. Most recently, it was a school for academically struggling students. In 1973 the original building burned and in the past years the other school buildings have deteriorated. In 2000, the U.S. Justice Department agreed to lift Seminole's desegregation order by 2003 if the county met certain conditions. Included in this



is rebuilding Crooms Academy and turning it into an academy of information technology. Professor Crooms is remembered as a man ahead of his times as he broke educational boundaries for black students in Seminole County. Today, Crooms Academy remains in this tradition as it establishes new territory in technology education at the high school level.

Crooms Academy of Information Technology is a dedicated magnet school that provides students with a wide range of educational choices. In addition to graduating

with a regular high school diploma and a National Academy Foundation Certificate, every student will be afforded the opportunity to select from a wide variety of Information Technology Certifications. Some of the certifications offered are A+, MOUS, MCP, CCNA, MCSE and many more.



Bio William J. McDermott, CEcD



Mr. McDermott's career in economic development spans 30 years in the public and private sectors. He has had economic development assignments at the state and local government level, public-private partnerships and the telecommunications industry with GTE. Prior to joining Seminole County, Bill worked with the Florida High Tech Corridor Council to implement a comprehensive web-based IT skills assessment survey with community college education partners in the 21 county region of the corridor. In July 2002, Bill assumed the duties of the newly created position of Director of Economic Development for Seminole County.

Also during his career he has served in economic development leadership roles including Chair of the American Economic Development Council and Past President of the Florida Economic Development Council.

Mr. McDermott served on the teaching and administrative staff of the Economic Development Institute at the University of Oklahoma for 15 years. EDI is the premier training program for economic development practitioners nationwide. Bill was awarded certification (CEcD) in economic development through exam administered by the American Economic Development Council.

Mr. McDermott holds a BA in Anthropology from West Chester University in Pennsylvania and an MBA from the University of Central Michigan. Bill has been married for 37 years to Eleanor and they have two grown children, Steven and Marybeth, both Florida residents, and two grandchildren.

Bio Kevin Gouvia, Creative Instincts

Kevin is currently an independent producer with his company Creative Instincts Digital Media & Creative Film Works. He is also an instructor for the Institute of Engineering at Lyman High school.

Kevin went to the school of Visual Arts and later went on to succeed as a designer of CBS News in Wash. DC after graduating from the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences. He sold his first TV show in 1981 to Gerber Carter Communications - "That Teen Show" which ran for four years in one hundred and ten markets.

Kevin has been involved in magazine, music videos and television production since 1980.

He has worked over sixty national TV commercials between N.Y. and L.A. until 1987 when he made Central Florida his home. At that time, he became interested in animation, traditional as well as computer generated.

Part of what makes Crooms Academy of Information Technology (AOIT) unique is its commitment to making technology education relevant to the "real world." To forge that vital link, we rely on partners from the local business community and offer a number of opportunities for involvement:

• The Business Advisory Committee

The Committee holds regular meetings and consists of representatives from local businesses and educational institutions who help guide Crooms AOIT toward its mission of providing cutting-edge innovation in teaching and learning through a technology- enriched academic environment.

Mentoring Program

Mentors meet one-on-one with students during the school year and act as supportive listeners, role models and personal coaches. They provide guidance, career exploration, academic assistance and advice on personal development. Mentors are screened and trained in a two-hour workshop and make a one-year commitment.

Instructional Coaches

Coaches work with a specific class and teacher and meet at least eight times per calendar school year to share industry knowledge, to provide information on career awareness and opportunities and to participate in real-life learning activities.

As students search for their career, field trips make the classroom experience come alive. Perot Systems, Sprint and Convergys have hosted such visits. Other field trip hosts are always needed.





The Naval Air Warfare Center Training Systems Division, located in Orlando's Central Florida Research Park, is the United States Navy's principal center for simulation, modeling, and training systems technologies.

Employing about one thousand engineers, scientists, and support personnel, the Center provides training systems development for a wide spectrum of military programs, including aircraft, surface ships, and submarines. These systems allow the Navy to train its personnel in the skills, knowledge, and expertise essential to the operation of vital weapons and support systems.

The Warfare Center not only crafts simulation technologies for the Navy, but is often an integral part of simulation development for the Army, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard, as well as many Federal, state, and local agencies.

Its location in Central Florida gives the Center the advantage of being co-located with other military research and development organizations, the University of Central Florida, and being near the center of the simulation-based entertainment industry.

The Center's advanced laboratories and highly skilled workforce, working from this unrivaled technology base, continue to produce cutting-edge advances in training simulation and human performance.




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


